A Manager's Report was given at this time by Manager Steve Defour:

- The sign project is still ongoing.
- Priority Health renewal the cost went up 10%, while the cap went up only 4.1%. Employees may have to pay a small amount per paycheck to cover it.

Public Comment was received at this time from Bob Whittaker. He lives in a subdivision off Mapes Road, north of M-72. That road has a pothole problem, and he stops in to request service often. When he does, the crew comes out and fills the holes only to have them re-appear in a few days. He has been to the Big Creek Township meetings, and they say they do not have a road fund. The Road Commission is responsible for fixing the roads. He wants to know what to do next. Manager Defour informed him that to work on Local roads, the Road Commission needs at least a 50% match from another entity. This could be the township, or a special assessment on the residents. Possibly a road millage.

A **County Commissioner's Report** was received at this time from Tom McCauley. He said that Greenwood Township is considering a millage to pay for dust control. The sheriff's department disposed of 35,000 pills that they received during the drug takeback. They are expecting a construction fence soon around the area sited for the new police department.
